

Change the Story - Civil Rights



During this unit, we will explore the past, present and future action around black civil rights and other important rights movements.

These are the key skills and knowledge you will develop through this unit:

Knowledge	<u>Locational Knowledge</u> I can identify places in the USA where civil rights events occurred. <u>Place Knowledge</u> I can recognise that different places have different rules. <u>Human and Physical Geography Knowledge</u> I can describe the some of the physical geographical challenges faced by the underground railroad.
Skills	I can ask and answer geographical questions about the physical and human characteristics of a location. I can use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping (Google Earth) to locate countries and features already studied and being to use them to find features about new locations. I can use locational and directional language including 4 compass directions to describe the location of features on a map. I can recognise the 8 points of a compass. I can use fieldwork to observe and record the human and physical features in the local area such as taking photographs, making notes and doing sketches. I can create maps of locations identifying a range of features with a key. I can identify features on an OS maps. I can begin to use 4 figure grid references.
