Welcome to our Autumn Term. Refreshed from our summer holidays, we have a busy term of learning ahead. First up, its straight into our adventures at Arthog then we'll be diving into this terms' topics from classification and trade to Victorian Shropshire and electronics!

PE Days

PE is on Monday and Wednesday

Please come to school wearing your PE kit; blue T-shirt, shorts and trainers. On colder days, dark jogging bottoms and our school sweatshirt should be worn over the blue T-shirt. This should keep you warm and looking smart.

Uniform and water bottles

On the days you do not have PE or Forest School, even if you have an after-school club, your child is expected to be in full uniform—including a tie. If you are having any difficulty finding uniform please inform school and we may be able to help you with certain items. School sweatshirts or cardigans, not hoodies, are to be worn if you are cold.

Please send your child in with a labelled water bottle each day and their journal as this is used as a learning tool throughout the week.

Reading Books

Children will bring home a ninja read to develop their fluency and comprehension and may also choose a rainbow read that can be of any level which they may read for pleasure.

The rainbow read may also be a book or magazine from home.

Ninja reads should be read and discussed at least three times. These are changed, when the child is ready, once a week.

Children who have passed all their reading ninja trials then become black belt readers. They will select their ninja read from the class rainbow reads or may choose a challenging text from home.

Forest School

We like to take advantage of our amazing forest school whenever we can. Please keep your eye out on class dojo for when your child may need to come in forest school kit.

Homework

Each week pupils in KS2 will receive a set of spellings for them to practise at home using a sentence sheet. Year sixes will also receive a set of revision books after October half term. They should aim to do one ten-minute test from each book per week.

All the children are expected to read five times a week and should colour in a ninja face in their journal to represent each read. An adult should then sign the journal to confirm that the child has read. Students with five reads and a signature will be entered into a raffle and, once they have been in the raffle, ten times they will have the opportunity to visit the in-school Cathedral Café for a treat!

It is vital children regularly practise their times tables at the level recorded in their journal. They can practise using their times tables sheet. If they have passed their times tables, it is still a good idea to regularly review these at home.
